The neighborhood villages and local community naturally felt the need of the college imparting higher education for their future generations. The CDC is consisted of well educated, socially responsible and humble human beings strongly determined and dedicated to the cause of social welfare. The college, from its beginning, has been a key factor in bringing about transformation in the rural area through education, bearing in the mind the motto of the Sanstha "Sa Vidya Ya Vimuktaye." The college is located in the rural area having a pleasant and healthy eco-friendly atmosphere. It has become a centre of innovation in the field of higher education in Aitawade Khurd and its surrounding area. The college fulfills its mission under the guidance of Secretary, Management, Principal, Teaching and Non-teaching staff and with proper representation of students on various committees and activities. The college is recognized as a best college in rural area not only for academic performance but for cultural, sports and extension activities. The college is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur having permanent affiliation. It is a single faculty co-education institution having 06 departments of Arts along with 17 add-on and skill based certificate courses. The college has its own beautiful premises and well-developed campus with all required infrastructure and modern amenities. The UGC has included the college in the list of the colleges under Section 2 (f) and 12 (b) of the UGC Act, 1956 in 2021 and accredited by NAAC at 'C' level with 1.77 CGPA in First Cycle in 2015.

- Extra efforts are taken to realize the application of subject knowledge through the Lead College activities, guest lectures and workshops thereby enabling enrichment of curriculum.
- The college is offering 8 UG subjects which follow the CBCS curriculum.
- The teachers are encouraged to participate in training programmes, refresher and orientation courses, FDP, summer schools, short term courses, conferences, seminars, workshops and INFOSYS courses.
- The college teachers contribute in Design and Development of University Curriculum as Members on Board of Studies (BoS) of Autonomous Colleges. Faculty members hold positions and are represented as members in University Academic Audit Committee, Research and Recognition Committee and as Subject Experts.
- Faculty members has contributed in Design and Development of Curriculum for in-house Add-on, Certificate and Value added Courses for holistic development of students. Teachers receive freedom to design the most relevant curriculum to make the programme employment-oriented considering the needs of the society.
- University designed curriculum and curriculum designed for various add-on and certificate courses include cross-cutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability.
- The college has introduced new 32 add-on certificate courses.
- Substantial number of staff has participated in 'Workshops on Revised Syllabus'.
- For effective curriculum delivery, our college provides modern teaching aids like Smart Panel, LCD projectors, Laptops and Computer Lab.
- IQAC monitors feedback mechanism. For sustainable curricular practices, the college collects, analyses, the feedbacks from the stakeholders and takes the necessary measures for improvement and it is made available on the college website for its stakeholders.

- The college faculty is highly qualified, committed and experienced 14 with teachers on full-time and temporary basis for UG courses with 04 Ph.D. and 02 M.Phil. holders.

- Student-centric teaching-learning methods and tools such as experiential learning through field projects is conducted. Large number field visits, excursion tours, industrial visits, skill development programmes and special counseling and lecture sessions are conducted.
- Two Smart pannel and 2 LCDs are installed in classrooms. All faculty members use ICT enabled teaching-learning process for enhancing teaching-learning through e-resources, power point presentations, Library Blogs, Department Google Groups, PPT Bank, YouTube channels, screening of movies, Google classroom, Zoom and Teachmint App etc. which has resulted into attainment of POs.
- IQAC ensures strict implementation of Academic Calendar including CIE by monitoring activities and implementing gaps are reviewed periodically.
- IQAC has designed and implemented an evaluation mechanism for achievement of programme outcomes to ascertain quality of teaching and learning process.

- Two smart panel, 35 computers, 13 laptops, 5 LCD Projectors, 6 printers, 03 scanners, digital camera, LED TV etc. are made available in the college.
- The student- computer Ratio is 7.96:1.

#### **Institutional preparedness for NEP**

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

• The vision of National Education Policy, to provide high quality education to develop human resources in our nation as global citizens, is well taken by the university. • A discussion among the faculty members were initiated on the key principles of NEP such as diversity for all curriculum and pedagogy with technological innovations in teaching and learning, encouraging logical decision making and innovation, critical thinking and creativity. • In view of the NEP, affiliating university is preparing new interdisciplinary centers integrating different disciplines. Academic programmes are being redesigned to include

Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary courses as

electives. • All programmes are being designed in such a way that students get maximum flexibility to choose elective courses offered. • It can be said that the affiliating University is proactively working towards implementation of the suggestions given in the NEP. • The college has organized workshop on New Education Policy 2020, , National Research Foundation (NRF) and National Credit Framework (NCrF). • The college has always strived for a multidisciplinary approach in its academic as well as co-curricular activities. • Currently, affiliating Shivaji University, Kolhapur has revised and implemented of its curriculum for students admitted in session 2022-23 onwards, in which provision is made to offer minor degrees in the fields other than the parent discipline.

#### 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

• The college follows a choice-based credit system prescribed by the affiliating University for all of its programmes. • Affiliating Shivaji University, Kolhapur is now passed a resolution related to the ABC in the Academic Council. The college has organized workshop on ABC and registered the ABC numbers of B.A. I students through Digilocker App. • The college preparedness in implementation of Academic Bank of Credits depends upon the guidelines of the affiliated University and Higher Education Department of Maharashtra Government. • We are trying to enroll our students for online courses through National Schemes like SWAYAM, INFOSYS etc., and is considering for credits earned against elective courses. • Revision of curriculum has been started for year 2022. These revisions are applicable for students admitted in session 2022-23 and onwards. • We are developing a system for executing ABC in true spirit.

#### 3. Skill development:

• The college has registered some students and faculty members for INFOSYS courses. • The focus is towards integrated knowledge acquisition and upgrading human skills towards creating a new league of employable youth. • The college is already conducting the skill courses as designed by affiliating University. • Also, under the employability of student in skill courses, the College has already been running courses Soft Skill and Personality Development, Basic Course in Yoga and Travel and Tourism etc. • The College is imparting skill based learning through various skill based certificate

	courses.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	• The college encourages learning of national language of Hindi by offering B. A. degree in Hindi and Marathi. •The Marathi and Hindi Department of college has organized refresher course on Teaching Methods for high school teachers to increase the awareness about Indian language. • In order to promote /integrate the local languages, arts and cultures, compulsory activities in the curriculum have to be added like literary activities etc. and through discussions/interactions/symposiums etc. in local languages which will fetch extra credit to the student. • These changes will also increase the employability opportunities for the teachers and subject matter experts of these languages. • Frequent field trips to local heritage sites and museums shall value their culture and traditions which will boost tourism sector in State and create awareness amongst students. • Indian Knowledge system will include knowledge from ancient India to modern India and clear sense of India's future aspiration with regard to education, health and environment.
5. - Evaluation is an integral part of teaching-learning process.
- Students are briefed in classroom regarding internal examination process, its time table, nature of question paper and evaluation as well as assessment to assure discipline and transparency.

- As per the Shivaji University rules and regulation semester examinations and assessment are conducted.
- The examination committee functions to maintain transference robustness of examination procedure.

- Paper setting and assessment done by respective teachers.
- In order to allay the fear of the students about the university examinations, Pre- semester examination is conducted in the college before the university examination. These answer papers are duly checked by the respective teachers of subject and distributed to the students at the earliest.
- Extra lectures were arranged for the slow learners so that it would overcome the difficulties in their studies. Departments conduct unit tests, seminars, group projects for internal evaluation.
- The aim of organizing seminar, projects is created confidence in the students and to enhance stage daring among the students. The individual department implements a strategy as per the convenience.
- After the college and university evaluation students' progress are assessed by the Principal and efforts are made for their overall development.
- The college internal examination committee works for transparent time bond and efficient continues evaluation process.
- The college and Shivaji University, Kolhapur have well-defined process for addressing evaluation grievances.

- Placement Cell and Competitive Examination Guidance Center provides career guidance and counseling.
- The college has started Institutional Scholarship to meritorious students.
